“Relive the dream” is what Community Unity is calling its free celebration of peace and Martin Luther King Jr.’s message, on Monday, January 21, starting at 3 p.m. at the Leora Brown School.

Community Unity has obtained special permission from the King Center in Atlanta to play live recordings of some of Dr. King’s most famous speeches and sermons. In addition, there will be a display of 200 tiles that were handmade by local children at World on the Square last August in Corydon.

The tiles were made by local children of all ages, backgrounds, and ethnicity. The children made the tiles to be displayed to the community and they included different symbols of peace (peace sign, doves, and the word for peace in many languages), along with tiles done freehand by children based on their own interpretation. There are even some tiles made by infants, with their handprint or footprint.

Some of Martin Luther King’s most moving speeches and sermons have been chosen to be heard once again in his own voice on live recordings. The public is invited to come enjoy refreshments, view the children’s peace tiles and listen to Dr. King. The schedule of speeches and sermons is as follows:

- 3:00 p.m. Give Us the Ballot
- 3:30 p.m. Guidelines for a Constructive Church
- 4:00 p.m. At Cobo Hall
- 4:40 p.m. At the End of the Selma March
- 5:30 p.m. Called a Fool
- 6:00 p.m. I Have a Dream
- 6:30 p.m. In Memphis (*his last speech*)
